Make checks payable to UHJA (Utah Hunter & Jumper Association). Mail completed entry forms and fee payments to: **Wendy Bates, 2172 W 8770 S., West Jordan UT, 84088**. All checks must be negotiable on or before the closing date for entries. (Postdated checks and two-party checks will not be accepted.) .

**If there has been a problem in the past with returned checks an exhibitor may be required to pay fees with certified funds or cash**

**ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES:** All entry blanks must be completed showing the name of the horse, rider, owner and the classes being entered and be signed by all parties listed. Parents or guardians must sign for minors. A check for the **\$30 show deposit or an open check** for fees **must be included**, or entries will be subject to the late fees being charged.

Entries for the first class each day must be made 15 minutes before the scheduled start of that class. Post entries for other classes must be made BEFORE THE END of the preceding class. Once a class has started late entries will not be accepted. If an entry is scratched from a class the horse show office must be notified before the start of that class or fees may not be refunded.

**ALL ADDITIONS, SCRATCHES AND OTHER CHANGE MUST BE MADE WITH THE SHOW SECRETARY BEFORE THE START OF A CLASS.**

---

**ENTRY FEES:** \$25 for regular classes; \$65 for UHJA Summer Hunter Classic, \$45 for the \$500 Jumper Classics, \$30 for the \$100 Hunter Classics.

**POST ENTRY & MISCELLANEOUS FEES:** \$20 flat fee per horse for entry blanks postmarked after the closing date above. An additional fee of \$5 per horse per class will be charged for adding a class on the day that class is being held. Exhibitors showing in classes where they have not been entered will be charged an additional \$15 per class (Ride-Did-Not-Enter fee) and may be eliminated from the class.

**DROP/CHANGE FEE:** \$5 per class added or dropped the day the class is held.

**GROUND FEE:** \$10 PER HORSE PER DAY SHOWING OR DOING WARM-UP ROUNDS (including those horses in stalls).

**STALL FEE:** \$20 for jumpers on Sunday. \$80 per stall for Wednesday to Saturday. \$100 for Wednesday to Sunday. (One person must pay for the stall if you are sharing it.) There are no daily rentals except for the jumper day Sunday. Additional shavings: \$12 per bale. **Contact Hillary Howe: phone -- 435.640.3705, e-mail – hillaryhowe@yahoo.com**

**TICKETED WARM-UP ROUNDS:** \$20 per round. Riders must be neatly and appropriately attired. Ticketed warm-ups are **not** available before the equitation classes on Friday, before the \$1000 UHJA Hunter Classic, or before the jumper classes on Sunday. Limit of two rounds per horse per division.

**RETURNED CHECK FEE:** There will be a \$20 fee charge on ALL returned checks.

**AWARDS:** for first place and **RIBBONS:** for first to fifth place in regular classes and first to eighth place in classics.

**PRIZE MONEY:** Classes with a \$1000 purses or a \$500 purse: 1<sup>st</sup>–24%, 2<sup>nd</sup>–20%, 3<sup>rd</sup>–17%, 4<sup>th</sup>–15%, 5<sup>th</sup>–13%; 6<sup>th</sup>--11%; \$100 purse will be divided: 1<sup>st</sup>—40%, 2<sup>nd</sup>—30%, 3<sup>rd</sup>—20%, 5<sup>th</sup>—10%. **Prize money will be deducted from entry fees.**

**HUNTER CHAMPION & RESERVE CHAMPIONSHIPS:** Champion awards and Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons will be awarded in all hunter divisions. In Cross Bar, Short Stirrup, Medium Stirrup and Long Stirrup divisions, both the hunter and equitation classes will be combined. In order for champion and reserve champion awards to be given all over fence classes must be held. Points will be awarded on the following basis: 1<sup>st</sup> - 9; 2<sup>nd</sup> - 6; 3<sup>rd</sup> - 4.5, 4<sup>th</sup> - 3, 5<sup>th</sup> - 1.5.

**BEST CHILD RIDER (17-UNDER), BEST CHILD RIDER ON A PONY, AND BEST AMATEUR RIDER AWARDS:** The winners of each award will be selected by the judge. The trainer of each of the award winners will also receive an award.

**VIRGINIA BENNETT MEMORIAL PERPETUAL TROPHY:** To be awarded at the annual awards banquet to the UHJA member who accumulates the highest number of points in the open, UHJA year-end award classes.

---

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be ready to enter the ring when his class or number is called. Exhibitors are advised to check the class list and/or jump orders at the gate and report any discrepancies to the show secretary. An exhibitor will not be allowed to enter the class unless his number is on the class list or the jump order. Failure to enter the ring when a class or number is called may result in elimination from the class. Entry fees will not be refunded when a class is missed because of negligence of an exhibitor.

**ALL CLASSES OFFERED AT THIS SHOW WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED according to the current UHJA and USEF rule books.** A copy of each rule book will be available in the show office. USEF rules will be applied when a subject is not covered in the UHJA Rule Book. The UHJA and USEF rule books will be followed in the case of typing errors. **This is not a USEF show.**

All exhibitors at this show shall agree to be subject to all of the rules of this show and the rules of the UHJA and USEF. The judge may not be approached during the show by an exhibitor, rider, owner, trainer or any member of their families regarding any decision made at this show. The Judge's decision in all classes shall be final. Any person wishing to talk to the Judge about a class should arrange a time with the show's steward.

**USEF Rule Book, GR108 dress: It is compulsory for all persons at hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured.** Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. A Show Committee must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar any entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience. Any exhibitor may wear protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) and/or a protective safety vest, specifically designed for use in equestrian sport in any division or class without penalty from the judge. The Federation recommends that the vest meet or surpass the current ASTM standard or be certified by the Safety Equipment Institute.

It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition, and the Federation, Show Committee, and Licensed Officials are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance.

The Federation makes no representation or warranty, express or implied, about any protective headgear, and cautions riders that death or serious injury may result despite wearing such headgear as all equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risk and as no helmet can protect against all foreseeable injuries.

Boots or shoes worn, while riding anywhere on the competition grounds, must have a distinguishable heel. Riders in jumper classes that are not wearing hunt clothes must wear a shirt, with a collar, that is tucked into their breeches. All riders must be neatly and appropriately attired and horses must be properly presented. Competitors must have their correct number clearly visible when entering any class. Competitors may be penalized at the discretion of the judge.

Ponies that do not have a current USEF measurement card (a copy filed with the UHJA) or that have not been measured at a UHJA approved show must be measured by the show's steward before competing in a pony class.

Copies of amateur cards should be attached to entry blanks or should be available when entering classes. Amateurs who do not have an USEF Amateur card must sign a statement saying that they qualify as an amateur, before entering a class for amateur riders. The age of a rider as of December 1 of the prior year shall be maintained throughout the show year.

Any questions regarding UHJA or USEF rules may be taken up with the show's steward or the horse show committee during the show. Any rule violations or cases of abuse should immediately be brought to the attention of the show steward, who has the authority to act at that time. These occurrences will be reported to the UHJA in the steward's report that is filed at the end of the show. If a question cannot be resolved, a protest or complaint may be filed with the UHJA Board of Directors according to the current UHJA Horse Show Manual and Rule Book.

The Utah Hunter & Jumper Association, Inc. (UHJA), its show employees, show management and board of directors and South Jordan Equestrian Park, will in no case be responsible for any loss, damage, accident or injury that may occur during the show due to any cause or circumstances. It will be a condition of entry that each exhibitor, owner, trainer, agent or any other interested parties shall hold harmless and indemnify The Utah Hunter & Jumper Association, Inc. (UHJA), its show employees, show management and board of directors and South Jordan Equestrian Park, for any damage or loss that may occur to any person, animal or property. The Utah Hunter & Jumper Association, Inc. (UHJA), its show employees, show management and board of directors and South Jordan Equestrian Park,, will not be responsible for any article of any kind or nature brought onto the show grounds that may be lost, destroyed, damaged or stolen. Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall also agree to the above.

The Horse Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or to cancel any entries and to prohibit any person from showing a horse in the ring and to remove any exhibitor, groom and/or horses from the show without being liable for claims for damages. The show will honor all suspensions imposed by the UHJA and by the USEF. Any exhibitor not complying with any of the rules of this show and/or for the UHJA or the USEF May be prohibited from showing in further classes and may forfeit any awards won at this show.

All owners, exhibitors and/or trainers will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents or their employees to stalls, buildings or other properties on the show grounds and will be billed accordingly. Control of horses on the show grounds will be in the hands of the show's management and employees. The show's management, employees and/or its judge reserves the right to excuse any person from the show ring or the schooling areas if they think that the person is creating an unsafe or disruptive situation. All attends of horses will be subject to their orders.

Horse show management reserves the right to cancel or combine any unfilled classes or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors. Hunter, jumper and medal classes may be held with only one entry. See the class specifications for combining classes.

DOGS MUST BE KEPT ON A LEASH and under control at all times.  
Food will be available on the show grounds.  
Breaks will be announced during the show.

## JUDGING SPECIFICATIONS

---

### HUNTER DIVISIONS CLASSES

**OVER FENCE CLASSES:** Horses are to be judged on an even hunting pace, manners, jumping style together with faults and way of going over the course. Horses will be jogged only if there is a question of lameness.

**UNDER SADDLE CLASSES:** Horses are to be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be obedient, alert, and responsive and move freely. They should not be eliminated for slight errors. Horses may be asked to hand gallop, collectively, one way of the ring, at the discretion of the judge, but never more than eight horses at one time. Horses will NOT be asked to hand gallop in short stirrup, medium stirrup, long stirrup, modified children's/amateur, children's, adult amateur, baby green, pre-green, or green hunter classes. Martingales are not allowed in any under saddle classes.

In classes for amateur riders MANNERS SHALL BE EMPHASIZED. In classes for junior riders MANNERS SHALL BE EMPHASIZED AND EXTREME SPEED SHALL BE PENALIZED. In classes for ponies MANNERS AND SUITABILITY OF THE PONY FOR THE RIDER SHALL BE EMPHASIZED AND EXTREME SPEED SHALL BE PENALIZED. In classes for junior riders horses and/or ponies must be handled by a junior during all phases of the class. In classes restricted to ponies, only junior riders may compete. Adults may ride ponies in classes where fences do not exceed 3'.

### **HUNTER SEAT EQUITATION DIVISIONS**

**OVER FENCE CLASSES:** Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not to be considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability. The following will result in elimination: a) fall of horse and/or rider, b) three cumulative refusals, and c) off course. The following constitute major faults and may be cause for elimination: a) a refusal, b) loss of stirrup, c) trotting while on course when not part of a test, d) loss of reins. Each competitor may circle once, if desired, before approaching the first fence. He shall then proceed around the course keeping an even pace throughout. If a refusal occurs at a double or triple, riders shall re-jump all elements of the combination. Any or all riders may be called back to work on the rail at a walk, trot and canter or to execute any of the appropriate tests included in the class requirements.

**NOT TO JUMP CLASSES:** Riders shall proceed at least once around the ring at each gait and, on command, reverse and repeat. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Riders shall then line up, on command, and any or all riders may be required to execute any of the appropriate tests included in the class requirements. Martingales are not allowed in any not to jump classes.

### **JUMPER DIVISION CLASSES**

Failure to enter the arena within one minute of being classed will incur elimination. A competitor will have 45 seconds from the time the judge's audible signal to cross between the start markers in the proper direction and start on course. If a competitor does not cross through the start line within the allotted time, the time on course will start when the allotted time expires.

Ties for first place will be decided by a jump-off. Ties, for other than first place, will be decided by a coin toss. Equal points will be awarded for the place tied for. All posted jump-orders will be selected, randomly, by the computer and posted by the start of the preceding class. Entries made after that time will be put at the first of the order. Jumper classes will be judged using the following tables:

**TABLE II, SEC. 1 - SPEED:** The first round is decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. Horses with clean rounds or equal faults are classified according to their time taken to complete the course.

**TABLE II, SEC. 2(A) – TIME FIRST JUMP-OFF:** The first round and first jump-off, if any, is decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. In the event of equality of faults after the first round, there will be one jump-off for first place only in which time will decide in the event of equality of faults.

**TALBE II, SEC. 2(B) – TME FIRST JUMP-OFF:** The first round and first jump-off, if any, is decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. If a competitor has gone clean in the first round, the competitor will, without leaving the ring, upon an audible signal, commence the designated jump-off course. A competitor with clear round may dismount, and with assistance if necessary, adjust tack and/or equipment; however, upon the audible signal to begin his/her round, the competitor is responsible to adhering to the 45 seconds rule as per JP134.3. A competitor who leaves the arena after a clear round (before or after the tone) will be considered to have retired from the jump-off. If there are no clear rounds and a tie exists for first place, there will be one jump-off in which time will decide in the event of equality of faults.

**TABLE II, SEC. 2(C) TIME FIRST JUMP-OFF:** The first round and immediate jump-off, if any, is decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed if any. If a competitor has gone clean in the first round, he will, upon crossing the finish line, commence the designated jump-off course. Time starts as the horse crosses the finish line for the initial course. If there are no clean rounds and a tie exists for first place, there will be one jump-off, in which time will decide, in the event of equality of faults. The use of a Time Allowed is optional in the first round.

**TABLE II, Sec 4, FAULT & OUT ONCE AROUND:** A competitor's round finishes with the first fault incurred under Table II. Points are awarded instead of faults, two points being awarded for each obstacle jumped cleanly and one point for the obstacle knocked down. The winner is the competitor who scores the greatest number of points. Time will decide in the event of equality of points.

**TABLE IV, SEC 1 – Optimum Time in the First Round:** The first round is decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. In case of equality of faults, ties will be broken on the following basis: an “Optimum Time” (defined as 4 seconds less than the Time Allowed for the course) will be posted on the course plan; the horse with the time on course closest to this Optimum Time (over or under) will prevail in the tie, next closest next, etc.

---

## **DIVISION SPECIFICATIONS**

---

**BABY GREEN WORKING HUNTER:** Open to horses that have not shown in ANY class (including equitation and jumper) at recognized UHJA or USEF shows (whether judged or not) that requires a horse to jump 3' or higher. Once a horse has won the UHJA Year End Award in this division it will no longer be eligible to compete in this division. Fences: 2'6"

**SLICK WILLIE OPEN HUNTER 3'**

Open to all horses and riders not restricted by prior showing.

**GREEN HUNTER 3', 3'3", 3'6", 3'9"**

Hunter eligibility for a horse begins when a horse of any age, competes for the first time in any over fences class with jumps at three feet (3'0") in height or higher in any Hunter or Hunter/Jumping Seat Equitation classes or sections held at a Federation or Equine Canada Licensed competition in North America. Once a horse begins its hunter eligibility, competing in jumper classes affects its Green Status and Eligibility according to HU103.12.

Horses may enter the Green Hunters in any height section for which they are eligible. Further eligibility in the Green Hunter section is determined by the height section in which they enter the system. A horse may compete in only one Green Hunter fence height section at any one competition. When a horse begins its hunter eligibility competing in hunter or equitation classes or sections with fence heights of 3'0" - 3'5", it remains eligible for Green Hunter 3'0" and 3'3" for two competition years (not necessarily consecutive). A horse that competes in any Hunter or Hunter/Jumping Seat Equitation class at a recognized competition in the United States or Canada with fence heights of 3'6" or higher is no longer eligible to compete in the Green Hunter 3'0" section but remains eligible to compete in the Green Hunter 3'3" section. A horse may compete in any other hunter or equitation class with fence heights of a maximum of 3'6" if otherwise eligible a maximum of four (4) times in one competition year prior to August 1 and remain eligible to compete in the Green Hunter 3'3". For jumper restrictions see Once a horse competes in a hunter or equitation class at a Federation or Equine Canada Licensed competition in North America with fence heights of 3'6" or higher a fifth time in one competition year, it is no longer eligible for the Green Hunter 3'3" section and it is only eligible to compete in the Green Hunter 3'6" section for the remainder of the competition year. That competition year will be considered the horse's Green Hunter 3'6" year. If a horse competes in a hunter or equitation class at a Federation or Equine Canada Licensed competition in North America with fence heights of 3'6" or higher after August 1, it is no longer eligible for the Green Hunter 3'3" section and it is only eligible to compete in the Green Hunter 3'6" section for the remainder of the competition year. That competition year will be considered the horse's Green Hunter 3'6" year. For jumper restrictions. Once a horse competes in a Federation or UHJA National Championship/Event with fence heights of 3'6" or higher he is no longer eligible for the Green Hunter 3'0" or 3'3" sections. Following a horse's Green Hunter 3'6" year, it is eligible to compete in the Green Hunter 3'9" section for one year. That one year will commence the next competition year that the horse competes in any hunter or equitation class at a Federation or Equine Canada Licensed competition in North America with fence heights of 3'6" or higher. A horse that has completed his Green Hunter 3'9" year is no longer eligible for any Green Hunter section. Once a horse begins its hunter eligibility, the following jumper restrictions apply: a. To remain eligible for Green Hunter 3'0 and 3'3", a horse may not compete in a jumper class at a Federation or Equine Canada Licensed competition in North America with fence heights higher than 3'3" (or 1.0m when class specifications list fence height in metric). To remain eligible for Green Hunter 3'6", a horse may not compete in a jumper class at a Federation or Equine Canada Licensed competition in North America with fence heights higher than 3'6" (or 1.10m when class specifications list fence height in metric). To remain eligible for Green Hunter 3'9", a horse may not compete in a jumper class at a Federation or Equine Canada Licensed competition in North America with fence heights higher than 3'9" (or 1.20m when class specifications list fence height in metric). In all cases, fence heights will be determined by the specifications of each section regardless of whether or not the fences are actually set at the regulation height. If a competition starts prior to or on November 30th Green status at the start of the competition is maintained throughout the competition

**PERFORMANCE HUNTER 3'3" and 3'6"  
HIGH PERFORMANCE HUNTER 3'9"**

A High Performance or Performance Hunter is a horse of any age and is not restricted by previous showing.

**SHORT STIRRUP 12-UNDER**  
**MEDIUM STIRRUP 13-OVER**  
**LOW CHILDREN'S HUNTER**  
**LOW ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER**

Classes are open to junior and amateur riders. Riders may show only one horse in one hunter over fence class at a given show. Riders showing in these divisions may not cross-enter into any other over fence classes that will count toward a UHJA year-end award. They may show in under saddle classes or unrecognized classes (low, maiden, novice, etc.) that they qualify for. If there are fewer than three entries in either the Short or Medium Stirrup divisions, these classes will be combined. If there are fewer than three entries in either of the Low Children's or Low Adult Amateur classes, they will be combined. Fences: 2' for the Short and Medium Stirrup divisions; Fences: 2' 6" for the Low Children's and Low Adult Amateur divisions.

**MODIFIED CHILDREN'S/ADULT AM HUNTER:** Open to junior and amateur riders. A horse showing in this division may not cross enter into any Children's, Adult Amateur, Junior or Amateur Owner classes or the Low Children's Jumper, Low Adult Amateur Jumper, High Children's Jumper or the High Adult Amateur Jumper division classes at this show. Fences: 2'9"

**SMALL PONY HUNTER**  
**MEDIUM PONY HUNTER**  
**LARGE PONY HUNTER**

Ponies who have not been measured and recorded with the UHJA and that are less than eight years of age must be measured at the first show they are entered in each year. Note: If the pony has a USEF measurement card it must be presented at the first show or the pony must be measured. After the pony is eight years old (has an aged mouth) it will be measured at the first show it is entered in. Ponies are divided into three sections, according to height: 1) SMALL PONY--not to exceed 12.2 hands; 2) MEDIUM PONY--over 12.2 hands but not to exceed 13.2 hands; 3) LARGE PONY--greater 13.2 hands but not to exceed 14.2 hands. Open to ponies 14.2 hands and under and to riders 17-under. Stallions are prohibited. No junior over 12 years of age may ride a small pony, and no junior over 14 years of age may ride a medium pony. Riders 17-under may ride for other exhibitors who have more than one entry in the under saddle class. Riders may not show more than three ponies at one height. Fences: small 2'3"; medium 2'6"; large 2'9". Distances for in and outs should be set at approximately 9' strides for small ponies, 10' strides for medium ponies and 11' strides for large ponies and must be changed for each height division.

**ADULT WORKING HUNTER:** To be ridden by amateur riders who reached their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday as of December 1, of the current show year. Horses and riders who compete in the Adult Amateur division may not compete in the Amateur Owner division at the same competition. Riders entered in the Adult Amateur Hunter division may not compete in any other class where obstacles are required to exceed 3'9" (1.15m) at the same competition. Horses may be ridden in the Junior Hunter section at the same competition if ridden by a member of the same family. Fences: 3'

**CHILDREN'S HUNTER, 17-UNDER:** To be ridden by an exhibitor who has not reached their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday as of December 1, of the current show year. Riders in Children's Hunter sections may not compete over fences in any other class at the same competition in which obstacles are required to exceed 3'3". Horses shown in this division at one show may not be shown in any of the Modified Children's/Adult Amateur hunter division at the same show. Stallions are prohibited.

**JUNIOR HUNTER 3'3"**  
**JUNIOR HUNTER 3'6"**

To be ridden by an exhibitor who has not reached their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday as of December 1, of the current show year. Riders may not cross enter into any class at 3'6" or higher in the hunter division, or higher than 3'9" in the equitation division, or higher than 1.20m in the jumper division at the same competition. All horses showing in the junior hunter section at USEF Regular Competitions must have a Federation measurement card. Horses entered in the 3'3" junior hunter division may not cross enter into the Children's Hunter division at the same show. Horses shown in this division at one show may not be shown in the Modified Children's/Adult Amateur Hunter division at the same show. Stallions are prohibited.

**AMATEUR OWNER HUNTER 3'3"**  
**AMATEUR OWNER HUNTER 3'6"**

To be ridden by amateur owners or amateur members of the owner's family. In either case the class is restricted to riders who have reached their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday as of December 1, of the current show year. Leased horses are not eligible and multiple ownership is not permitted unless all owners are members of the same immediate family. An amateur who competes for a person outside of his/her family may not compete in a class restricted to Amateur Owners at the same competition.

**HORSE CRAZY HUNTER SERIES:** Open to junior and amateur riders. The class will consist of one round. Scores will be announced after each round. Those scores will be sent in with the show's results. The horse/rider combination must receive a score in this class in at least three (3) classes during the year to qualify for the final class at the Fall Classic & Medal Finals show. The top three scores for each horse/rider combination will be added together and the average will be used as the first round score for the class at the finals. A horse may be shown by only one rider in this class at an individual show. Riders may show more than one horse in the class. A Horse Crazy gift certificate for \$500 for first place, \$250 for second place, \$125 for third place, \$75 for fourth place, and \$50 for fifth place will be given to the winner of this class at the Medal Finals. Fences: 2'9" for Modified Children's/Adult Am. Riders, 3' for children's and adult amateur riders and 3'3" and 3'6" for junior and amateur owner riders.

**UHJA PONY HUNTER SEAT MEDAL:** Open to junior UHJA members, 17-under, riding ponies 14.2 hands and under. No junior over 12 years of age may compete on a small pony, and no junior over 14 years of age may compete on a medium pony. Suitability of the pony to the rider will be emphasized. Two tests (USEF tests 1-9) are required in the first round. Only one rider per pony. To be judged by the same criteria as the USEF Pony Hunter Seat Medal class. Fences: 2'3" for small, 2'6" for medium and 2'9" for large ponies.

**UHJA HUNTER SEAT MEDAL, 17-UNDER:** Open to junior UHJA members, 17-under. Courses must have at least one combination that includes an oxer and two changes of direction (change of lead) after the first obstacle. Two or more tests of the top four competitors may be required (USEF Tests 1-19). Only one rider per horse. To be judged by the same criteria as an USEF Hunter Seat Medal class. Fences: 3'

**UHJA ADULT AMATEUR MEDAL:** Open to amateur UHJA members 18-over. The course must have at least one combination that includes an oxer and two changes of direction (change of lead) after the first obstacle. Two or more tests or the top four competitors may be required (USEF Tests 1-19). Only one rider per horse. To be judged by the same criteria as the USEF Adult Amateur Medal class. Riders showing in this class may not enter the UHJA Adult Amateur Medal, 2'9". Fences: 3' in height.

**UHJA MODIFIED JUNIOR/AMATEUR MEDAL:** Open to junior and amateur UHJA members. Riders in this division may not show in any other medal classes at this show. The course must have at least one combination that includes an oxer and two changes of direction (change of lead) after the first obstacle. Two or more tests or the top four competitors may be required (USEF Tests 1-19). Only one rider per horse. To be judged by the same criteria as the USEF Hunter Seat Medal class. Fences: 2'9" in height.

**UHJA JUNIOR/AMATEUR MEDAL, 3'6":** Open to junior and amateur riders who are UHJA members. The class is to be judged 50% on flat work and 50% on over fence work. Courses must have at least one combination that includes an oxer and two changes of direction (change of lead) after the first obstacle. Tests may be required at the judge's discretion (USEF Tests 1-19). Only one rider per horse. To be judged by the same criteria as the Mcclay Medal class. Fences: 3'6"

**UHJA JUMPER SEAT MEDAL:** Open to junior and amateur UHJA members. The class is a test of individuals as show jumping riders. Competitors must use the same horse in both phases of the competition. A liverpool is recommended. The course should be of the type used in a Junior or Preliminary jumper class. Time allowed should be calculated at 360 yards per minute and timed electronically or manually. Time and jumping faults should be taken into consideration by the judge in evaluating the rider's performance. In the flat phase, riders will show in a group at the working walk, the working trot sitting, the working trot rising, as well as showing a lengthening of stride; the working canter, and the working canter showing a lengthening of stride. All riders being considered for an award will be required to show the working canter on the counter lead for at least one full revolution of the arena in both directions, but not more than 12 exhibitors will counter canter at one time. Judges may require additional tests. Fences: 3'3".

**PONY JUMPER:** Open to ponies 14.2 hands and under and to riders 17-under. Stallions are prohibited. All entrants will compete over the same heights and distances. See the pony hunter division for measurement rules. Fences: .75m (2'5")

**JUMPER .75m:** Open to all horses and riders. A horse/rider combination that is showing in this division may not jump higher than .85m (2'9") in any class (hunter/jumper/equitation) at the same show Fences: .75m (2'5")

#### **LOW CHILDREN'S JUMPER**

**LOW ADULT AMATEUR JUMPER:** Open to junior and adult amateur riders. The same horse/rider combination may not cross enter into any class at 1.15m in height or higher at the same competition. A horse that is shown in these divisions may not cross-enter into the High Children's or High Adult Amateur division. Fences: 1.00m (3'3")

#### **HIGH CHILDREN'S JUMPER**

**HIGH ADULT AMATEUR JUMPER** Open to junior and amateur riders. A horse/rider combination shown in these divisions may not cross enter into any classes 1.20m or higher at the same competition. A horse shown in this division may not be cross-enter into the Low Children's or Low Adult Amateur at the same show. Fences: 1.10m (3'7")



**TRAINING JUMPER:** Open to all horses and riders. Fences: 1.05m (3'5")

**HIGH TRAINING JUMPER:** Open to all horses and riders. Fences: 1.15m (3'9")

**MODIFIED OPEN JUMPER:** Open to all horses and riders. Fences 1.25m (4'1")

**OPEN JUMPER:** Open to all horses and riders. Fences: 1.30m (4'3")

**HIGH TRAINING JUMPER:** Open to all horses and riders. Fences: 1.15m (3'9")

**MONEY PENNY MEMORIAL POWER & SPEED CHALLENGE:** Open to all horses and riders not restricted by showing in previous divisions. The class will be scored under Table II, Sec. 2(C), Power & Speed. The horse/rider combination must be double clear at least three (3) times to qualify for the final at the UHJA Fall Classic & Medal Finals. The horse may be ridden by only one rider in a given class. Riders may ride more than one horse in a given class. Prize(s) sponsored by Rose Ranch. Fences: 1.00m (3'3")

**\$100 CROSS BAR HUNTER CLASSIC**

**\$200 SHORT/MEDIUM STIRRUP HUNTER CLASSIC**

**\$200 LONG STIRRUP HUNTER CLASSIC**

**\$1000 UHJA HUNTER CLASSIC:** Open to all horses and riders, Fences: 3'. Horses showing in the class must have been entered and shown in at least two classes that would count towards UHJA Year-End awards.

**\$500 UHJA LOW JUMPER CLASSIC:** Open to all horses and riders. Horses shown in this class may not enter the \$500 UHJA High Jumper Classic. Horses showing in this class must have been entered and shown in at least one class that would count towards a UHJA Year-End Awards. Fences: .95m – 1.00m (3'1" - 3'3")

**\$500 UHJA HIGH JUMPER CLASSIC:** Open to all horses and riders. Horses shown in this class may not enter the \$500 UHJA Low Jumper Classic. Horses showing in this class must have been entered and shown in at least one class that would count towards a UHJA Year-End Awards. Fences: 1.05m – 1.15m (3'6" to 3'9")

**TAYLOR MOSSING MEMORIAL PONY CLASSIC:** Fences 2'3", 2'6", 2'9". The owner of the pony being shown in this class must be a UHJA member.

**BLAINE KNIGHT MEMORIAL JUMPER:** Open to all riders and horses. The owner of the horse being shown must be a UHJA member. The horse/rider combination may not have shown in classes at this show where fence heights exceed 1.00m (3'3"). Fences: .95m-1.00m (3'1"-3'3")

**HUNTER HACK:** Open to riders who are not showing over fences 2'9" or higher. This is an under saddle class and there will be two fences, cross 2' in height, that will be jumped at the end of the flat phase.

**OPEN EQUITATION 3'**

Open to junior and amateur riders.

**HOPEFUL JUMPER:** Open to all horses and riders. Fences: .70m (2'3")

**WARM-UP JUMPER:** Open to all horses and riders. Fences: .85m (2'9")

**SCHOOLING JUMPER:** Open to all horses and riders. Fences: .85m (2'9")

**HIGH SCHOOLING JUMPER:** Open to all horses and riders. Fences: 1.00m (3'3")
